Part 1: Statement of intent

This is the health and Safety Policy of **The Otford Society**.

It relates to maintaining the health and safety of our volunteers when participating in particular projects being undertaken on the Society's behalf.

Our health and safety policy is to:

- prevent accidents and cases of ill health amongst our volunteers
- manage health and safety risks amongst our volunteers
- have assessed health & safety conditions (a health & safety risk assessment) prior to undertaking a project involving volunteers.
- have prepared access to emergency procedures prior to undertaking a project.
- provide clear instructions and information to ensure our volunteers are competent to carry out their designated project in a safe manner.
- provide, (where required) protective equipment.

- 4: All volunteers participating in Society projects should:
 - Co-operate with their project 'leads' on health & safety matters
 - Take reasonable care of their own health & safety.
 - Report all health & safety concerns to their 'lead' or a member of the trustees.

Part 3: Arrangements for Health and Safety

Risk Assessment

- A risk assessment will be carried out on any project involving volunteers.
- These assessments will be reviewed should working methods or conditions change.

Training

- We will (when required for safety reasons) provide volunteers and sub-contractors with appropriate training.
- We will provide personal protective equipment.

Consultation

-We will consult all volunteers involved on a project on health & safety matters at the commencement of each project.
